We have loved reading a variety of sensory stories this term, our favourites being 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and 'The Enormous Watermelon'. We have really improved at using symbols at the end of the sessions to request which props or sensory experiences we would like again.

We have also spent a lot of time this term focusing on using core vocabulary boards and for all those where it is appropriate establishing the use of our new communication boards. We have all made progress in using our methods of communication and have been communicating choices and preferences and even commenting on experiences. For the last 6 weeks we have also had a weekly session delivered by the Speech and Language therapists Izzy and Emma, which we have loved taking part in.

We have focused on number this term and have taken part in numerous number songs, linked to our different themes. We have also introduced some mathematical language like long and short, big and small, full and empty, during our Look and Listen sessions.

We have loved our community visits out to South Park and have all grown in confidence using all the different equipment. We also liked going out on the school minibus to St James' church in Gawsworth to look at the Christmas trees and we all behaved wonderfully. We have some more visits in the bus planned for next term!

THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN: SUPERSTARS

AUTUMN TERM 2022

This term, we have explored our topic of 'Superstars'. This has involved making superhero related artwork and exploring superhero sensory trays, but also included looking at the heroes within our community, both in and outside of school. We have gotten to know the people who help us in our school and where we can find them with a school 'scavenger hunt', and have explored those who help in the wider community with a visit from a fire engine!

We have also looked at what makes us feel 'super' by looking at healthy vs. unhealthy foods. We used healthy foods to follow some simple recipes, such as making a rainbow fruit salad and healthy fruit smoothies. We also had a chance to try lots of different foods and explore whether we did or didn't like them.

We have been working on our number and counting skills in Maths this term, looking at numbers to 20 and the concept of more and less. We have had great fun counting pom poms, jellybeans, ducks and more! We have also enjoyed learning lots of counting songs with props to help us.

In English, we have explored stories related to our term topic, such as Super Duck, Knights and Dragons and Unite, Mog and the VET. We have explored these with the aid of sensory stories and colourful semantics.

In our phonics sessions, we have been working really hard in our different groups. In our Pathway 1 group, we have progressed with our core word 'more' and have been developing their pre-requisite skills to reading, such as attention and anticipation in Look & Listen sessions and sensory exploration and integration in Sensology. In our Pathway 2 group, we have been working on distinguishing different kinds of sounds and trying to describe them, as well as listening out for and identifying initial sounds in words.

We have had some lovely experiences this term, with weekly sessions from the Music Therapist, daily Sing & Sign sessions, as

well as the opportunity to use the computer suite, library, ball pool and light room in our lessons.

We have had a fantastic Autumn term and cannot wait for the next one! We hope everyone has a wonderful Christmas break.

Arighi Class

THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN SUPERHEROES

We have worked very hard in Arighi class this term. In September we welcomed some new pupils and they have settled in very well. We have been working on our superhero theme across the curriculum. We have had lots of fun and learned new skills.

English

In English, we have been reading *The BFG* by Roald Dahl. We have really enjoyed the story and students have demonstrated excellent listening and comprehension skills. Students have also worked on handwriting: pencil control and letter formation. Some have been writing short phrases and sentences with the correct word order. Some students have enjoyed sensory stories during English and have particularly liked *The Scarecrows Wedding* and *The Gruffalo*.

Maths

In Maths, the focus has been number and we have been counting and using numbers up to 5, 10, 20 and one hundred. In other areas of the curriculum such as Enterprise, Gardening and Cooking. Students have shown how they can apply their number skills by following recipes using tablespoons, counting out seeds and bulbs and counting, sorting and matching items when making products to sell at the Christmas Market.





Other areas of the curriculum

In Challenge, students from Arighi class have been learning about forces and have taken part in lots of practical challenges such as designing a parachute, making a kite, building a model boat from recycled materials and a balloon powered car.

In Community sessions, students have been finding out all about the Vikings and we had a visit from a Viking who showed us lots of interesting artefacts, told us stories and helped us recreate a battle scene. This really brought the topic to life.



In PHSE we have been learning about public and private. We have also been learning about work and the role of health professionals. The school nurse and the physiotherapist came into class and talked to us about their jobs and showed us some of their equipment.

In PE Arighi students have been working on balance. We have also been playing table cricket where we have improved our batting skills.







In Creativity, we have been looking at the work of Louise Bourgeois and Dali, we have made a large paper Mache sculpture of a spider and created images of surreal creatures using our imaginations. We also made artwork based on fireworks and Halloween themes this term.





Some students attended Fallibroome Academy where they joined sixth formers to work on a song for the Christmas performance.

We have concentrated on number this term. We have counted in a variety of situations that will help us out in the real world. We have also worked hard on using money in a café situation.


PSHCE

WHAT SIXTHFORM 1 HAS BEEN DOING.

IN THIS ISSUE

Sixth form 1 students have made a fantastic start to the academic year. They have quickly settled into a learning environment with new classmates and teaching staff. Our students have shown that they are supportive of each other's goals, and it has been lovely to see friendships developing.

ICT

During ICT sessions some of our learners have been working towards the ASDAN unit engaging with technology. Sophie has been using switches to activate a range of appliances. Other students have been developing their general computer skills practicing typing, using a mouse and copying and pasting into PowerPoint slides.

Enterprise

Sixth form 1 students have taken part in 2 very successful enterprise projects over Halloween and Christmas. Students made and sold items throughout the school making over £100 across both sales. These projects gave students an opportunity to practice a range of skills across the curriculum including gaining evidence for the ASDAN unit developing number skills.

Community

Since September students have regularly attended swimming sessions at Macclesfield leisure centre. They have also visited South Park and the College café. Sixth form 1 students have enjoyed these visits and have been able to apply the learning from the ASDAN keeping safe unit in the broader community.

Cooking

We have split our 2 terms of cooking into 2 topics. Bread based recipes and pastabased recipes. Students have been using the food tech room to plan and make and range of dishes including pizza, spaghetti bolognaise and garlic bread. Students have used cooking lessons to work on demonstrating practical skills required in the ASDAN unit safety in the home and community/

Vocational studies

Vocational studies sessions give students in both sixth form classes the chance to practice work related skills or take part in therapies sessions. We have run gardening, computer programming and café skills lessons. Students have particularly enjoyed running a café for

pupils and staff lower down the school to attend.

Key Skills Maths and English

On Friday mornings sixth form 1 and 2 students have been joining together to either take part in sensory stories and art or key skills maths and English lessons. Key skills maths and English focuses on developing student's literacy and numeracy skills by generalizing their knowledge into practical life skills tasks. During Maths, students have been working on the ASDAN unit developing number skills. As part of this unit students have been using their number skills to lay the table correctly for different numbers of people and gather the correct number of items to make tea for groups of people up to 5. During English students have been working towards The ASDAN unit Safety in the home and community.
