## Hovis Class Easter Newsletter 2023

THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN: HOW THINGS WORK

**SPRING TERM 2023** 

This term, we have explored our topic of 'How Things Work'. We have looked at different lifestyles and how people live, such as looking at the culture and practices of China by making a school display of a dragon for Chinese New Year and trying some different Chinese foods. We looked at where people live, exploring houses and eventually decorating our own in Creativity. We also looked at how people dress and get ready for each season, selecting and trying on different winter clothing that would keep us warm. We put this into practice on our first trip out of school this year to South Park, which we hope to continue in the Summer term. Pupils did a fantastic job at selecting and putting on the appropriate winter clothes and walking to the park to enjoy the play equipment!

We have been working on Shape and Measurement in Maths this term, initially looking at weight, height and capacity and then moving on to 2D and 3D shapes. Pupils have loved getting to physically interact with these topics, such as using scales to explore weight and performing action songs to become 'tall' and 'small' themselves.

In English, we have explored stories related to our term topic, such as A Squash and a Squeeze, Tiddler, The True Story of the Three Little Pigs and finishing with The Gruffalo. We have been working hard on understanding and using key concepts such as 'same' and 'different' when comparing 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs' with the original story, and have enjoyed sequencing the characters and events of The Gruffalo.



We have really enjoyed the Spring term and can't believe it's already time for Easter. We hope you have a lovely Easter holiday!





#### Topic This Term- How things work

A lovely term with fun and interesting activities and we are now all ready for Easter. We've enjoyed some dance activities in Arts' week and lots of creativity. We have had World Book Day, Red Nose Day and a fabulous Easter egg hunt and visit from the Easter Bunny. We are saying goodbye to a staff member who is going to another class and welcoming a new teacher next term – Laura Pinkerton. Wishing you all a Happy

English – We have been working hard in English this term on the books: 'Lost and Found', 'Goldilocks and the three bears', and some great non-fiction on penguins and a book about blue whales and how their size compares to our Universe. We have just read 'The Easter Story' which is also part of our work in Community and Goldilocks has supported our work on measure in Maths. We are developing our mark making skills and letter formation and have enjoyed visits to Park Lane School Library to share books with our friends.

Maths – We have been focusing on measure and shape. We have enjoyed new songs to start sessions focused on size and have done practical activities on big and small, long and short and heavy and light. We had the school nurse weigh and measure us and we had good fun! We have looked at how time is measured by clocks and timers and explored our own daily routines. We have explored 2D and 3D shapes and learnt their names. We have been able to find shapes in our everyday environment and some of us can name them

Challenge – We have been learning about push and pull forces in science, we have investigated different toys and how they move and experimented with magnets. – which was great fun! As part of how things work, we have made lots of different things in DT- cakes, loaves etc. We have used lots of equipment and utensils. We planted sunflower seeds to see how they will grow and what they need to make them thrive. We look forward to seeing how big they are when we return after the Easter holidays.

Creativity – We have been finding out about different pieces of music such as Benjamin Britten's 'The Storm', using instruments to create sounds and moods and making marks to the music to explore notation. We have also enjoyed seasonal art and craft activities for spring, Mothers' Day and Easter.

Individuality-in PE we have been working on our throwing and receiving skills. In SoSafe we have been starting to talk about personal space and consent with the story of 'Don't Hug Doug'.

Community – We have been learning about Fairtrade and what is 'fair' for workers and farmers. We have explored where some of our products come from like tea, coffee, chocolate and bananas. We bought some products and used recipes that included our Fairtrade products. We worked hard as a team to bake a Fairtrade Earl Grey Tea loaf and as a little enterprise we took some around school and sold to staff. We did try it ourselves and we can confirm it was delicious! We have all worked hard on our individual PLG goals and undertaken a range of personalized numeracy and literacy activities.





#### English & Literacy

In English & Literacy our focus has been on developing our reading & writing skills. We have undertaken a range of activities to support our PLG's including doing phonics work and focusing on our selected text 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'.

#### RE

In RE we have been exploring Buddhism and have had an opportunity to experience Buddhist artefacts, symbols, music and clothes. We have taken part in meditation and yoga sessions and were lucky to be able to be visited by a practicing Buddhist who explained the religion to us and answered our questions on Buddhism.





#### Math's & Numeracy

In Math's & Numeracy we have focused on learning via the shape, space & measure topics. We have learned about different sizes of clothes, measured length, area and mass using rulers and scales, discovered how shapes are used for safety signs and developed our basic numeracy ability through a range of personalized PLG activities.

#### **PSHCE & Enterprise**

In PHSCE & Enterprise we have developed our knowledge of social skills and gained an understanding of both appropriate behavior and what are the qualities of a good friend.

#### Science

In Science we have started to develop our practical skills and our knowledge of different types and qualities of materials. We have made slime, measured craters and simulated volcano's using vinegar and baking powder.





#### **Humanities**

In Geography we have studied our varied and interesting local environment, and the many places of interest that it contains. We have studied both Cheshire & the Peak District and discovered a range of activities that we would like to participate in.





#### MFL

We have gained experience of a number of languages & cultures in MFL. As well as learning some simple words & phrases in French, Spanish & Italian we have also had the opportunity to sample many of the most popular foods of the countries.





#### PE & Swimming

Swimming has gone really well this term and we have all developed our confidence in the water and had a lot of fun. We have had the chance to take part in a range of sports / exercise in PE including football, basketball and completing an assault course.

## Sixth Form 1

In Art, we have enjoyed exploring different sculpture and pottery techniques. Students have made coil and pinch pots and have created beautiful tiles imprinted with patterns found in nature.
