THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN: OUR WORLD

**SUMMER TERM 2023** 

This term, we have explored the topic of 'Our World'. In Community, we explored the many sights of London, read stories and even made cucumber sandwiches for an 'afternoon tea'!

This was the perfect time to discuss the coronation of a new King, which we celebrated as a school with a special coronation dinner and practicing being Kings and Queens for a day!

In Challenge we have been looking at animals, exploring their textures, patterns, and habitats. We combined this with ICT, with some pupils doing switch work or using the touch screen and others going to the ICT Suite to continue their progress in using the school computers independently to facilitate their learning.

Our Individuality lessons have been focused on celebrating the ways we are unique and special, and we have explored the many character strengths that all the pupils of Hovis have. We have also continued our work on emotions, recognizing how we are feeling and what we can do when we feel a certain way.

In Creativity, we have looked at British Folk culture. We worked on our threading skills to help join and create a patchwork tapestry, took inspiration from British artists such as David Hockney to create landscapes and looked at Morris dancers in Music to help us practice our rhythm with bells.

We have been busy in Maths this term focusing on Pattern, Time, Movement & Direction and Statistics. We've done lots of practical activities to help us learn about directional language, such as using the parachute, and have worked together as a class to answer questions about our birthdays and favourite foods using pictographs and tally charts.

We have continued exploring new texts in our English groups. Some of us have been exploring sensory stories, Look & Listen sessions, Sensology and core word activities. Others have enjoyed being archers when looking at Robin Hood, exploring synonyms when reading The Tortoise and the Hare, and practicing creating sentences using Colourful Semantics when reading What The Ladybird Heard at the Seaside.

Our pupils have been working hard in their PE and Swimming lessons, working on their coordination skills when throwing and catching or when practicing new skills in the Hydro pool.

Outside the curriculum, some of us have accessed interventions such as Animal Therapy and hairdressing desensitization sessions. We have also enjoyed celebrating events such as the birthday of the NHS, the Coronation, Sports Day, and of course some class birthdays.

We have also had a visit from a sensory theatre group to take some of our learners 'under the sea', which was a lot of fun!

Of course, we have been practicing our transitions to new classes towards the end of term. We have been really impressed with all our students at what is a time of change and uncertainty. We are sad to be saying goodbye to the students who are moving to new classes, but we will not forget all the amazing progress and happy memories we made together this year!

# Mulberry Class Summer 2023 Newsletter

THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN OUR WORLD

This year so far, by Laura Pinkerton....

Having only begun working at Park Lane, in Mulberry class, after the Easter Holidays I can't believe how the time has flown and all the learning we've packed into what's been a really busy term. It's been a privilege to teach the children in Mulberry and I'm looking forward to continuing to teach some of them come September.





#### English & Literacy

In English & Literacy our focus has been text-based. From Easter to the Whit holidays the children focused on the story Funny Bones, creating their own adventure stories. Some of the children listened to sensory stories and took part in tailored communication sessions. After the Whit holidays we read Diary of a Wombat and the children used this book as well as the You Choose books to create their own diaries – what imaginations they have! We've taken advantage of having a fabulous school library and the children have had a different nonfiction topic each week to explore.

#### **Humanities**

There's been a Geography focus this term; we've been exploring England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Not only have the children had a great time exploring flags, but they've also tasted Welsh cakes, make their own version of Edinburgh Castle and reenacted the story of George and the Dragon!





#### Math's & Numeracy

In Maths & Numeracy we have focused on learning about Position, Direction and Movement. This has been a really practical topic to teach; from wearing left and right gloves, to moving around the classroom/playground and moving under and over equipment during sensory circuits.

#### **PSHCE & Enterprise**

In PHSCE we use MY Happy Mind to focus our well-being; the children have thought about and engaged in sessions about appreciation, self-worth and their own strengths – of which there are MANY!

#### Science

In Science we have grown plants from seed, watched a caterpillar turn in to a chrysalis then a butterfly (and fly free) and learnt about the many different life cycles found in nature.

#### Literacy




# Barnaby

Barnaby have once again been very busy this term. Our topic


has been looking at the Wonders of the World, which included
