Jodrell Class



Wow, what a whirlwind the Spring Term has been! We've had so much fun in Jodrell and our school family has thrived together. Every child has grown in confidence over the course of this term; they are challenging themselves to try new things with great success. We couldn't be happier with the effort and enthusiasm they put into each and every day.

This week we had a wonderful at South Park. This was our first school outing together as a class. We are so incredibly proud of the children; they behaved beautifully throughout. This was a lovely opportunity for the children to develop their language and social skills. They loved exploring and playing together on the equipment! Were hoping to arrange more trips during the summer term as this one was such a success.

This term the theme has been Global Warriors. We have embraced this theme and incorporated it into different parts of the curriculum.

In Challenge we have explored different materials and their properties. We've incorporated this into play activities, for instance, digging in sand to find rubbish e.g., plastic, cardboard and metal. As the term has progressed, we have been thinking about how rubbish can be dangerous for wildlife and the importance of looking after our natural environment. In one of our Challenge lessons, the children did some 'pond dipping'. First, they cleared the rubbish from the water (which was in a large plastic tub), then they explored the creatures in the water using magnifying glasses. They loved this!

In Creativity, we have been reusing rubbish to make art work, for instance printing flowers with scrunched up plastic.

The children have been learning new vocabulary and the signs. We have familiarized the children with the following signs: plastic, glass, metal, paper and of course recycling.













The children in Jodrell Class all enjoy listening to stories. In Literacy, we have looked at a number of different stories this term including The Gingerbread Man; The Three Little Pigs; and We're Going on a Nature Hunt. All of these stories have been big hits! The children particularly like it when I get carried away doing actions to the story or take on the role of one of the characters!

In maths we have been learning about shapes and measures. The children have been sorting shapes, matching, and labelling shapes. We have also been exploring concepts such as 'tall & short', 'big & small', and 'full & empty'. It would be great if the children could show you what they know at home. Maybe they could build a tall tower; show you a small insect; or choose a full glass.

We are looking forward to the summer term; our topic will be living things.

THIS TERM OUR TOPIC HAS BEEN: GLOBAL WARRIORS

SPRING TERM 2024

This term, we have explored our topic of 'Global Warriors' and focused on the concepts of recycling and protecting our world.

In Challenge, we have been exploring different materials and sorting them in order to properly recycle them. We have also been reusing materials to make new creations, such as using weaving skills to create something new from strips of paper or plastic bags. In Community, we have been learning about our beaches and oceans, exploring lots of new vocabulary. We also explored some stories to help us understand how to protect these environments, such as 'Clem & Crab' and 'A Whale's Tale'. In Individuality, we have continued to explore our emotions and the different strategies our students can use to either ask for help or regulate in the classroom. We have also practiced new Signalong sings related to our topic, as well as working on our balance and ball skills in PE such as weaving between cones with a football or attempting to catch a ball with catch nets. Lastly, in Creativity we have explored and recreated different famous artworks (such as 'Starry Night' by Van Gogh) as well as learning some new musical vocabulary to create our own version of the song 'Boom Chicka Boom'.

We have been working on Shape and Measurement in Maths this term, initially looking at weight, height and capacity and then moving on to 2D and 3D shapes. Pupils have loved getting to physically interact with these topics, such as using bottles and measuring jugs to explore capacity, and copying patterns and instructions by using 3D shapes as building blocks.

In English, we have explored stories related to our term topic, such as 'Michael Recycle', 'Fox's Socks' and 'A Little Paper Caper'. Pupils have particularly enjoyed interactive, sensory versions of the stories and have effectively used their communication mats

to discuss what is happening in the stories as they are being told. They have also allowed us to develop our vocabulary, exploring words around clothing and materials.

We have had weekly class sessions with the Speech and Language team this term, who have run sessions centered around core words and narrative comprehension. We have had great fun using our individual methods of communication, such as symbol mats and communication books.

We have been making great progress in our swimming sessions in the school's Hydrotherapy Pool with our swimming teacher. Some have been working on developing their confidence in the pool, and have started to explore different ways to move in the water. Others have been working on different swimming strokes and going underwater. These sessions have also been a great way for our students to practice their independent dressing skills.

We have had a busy term with lots of events and surprises, such as Pancake Day, an author book reading for World Book Day and an Easter Egg Hunt with eggs donated by FOPLSS! We also had fun celebrating Red Nose Day, Valentine's Day and Down Syndrome Awareness Day, which have all been great opportunities to discuss important topics around respect, tolerance and family.

We have had a great Spring term in Hovis class - we hope you have a lovely Easter holiday!


In Individuality, we have enjoyed expanding our knowledge about ourselves, our strengths and what we can do to help others

we have also welcomed back Mike from LoveMusicTrust and have made




excellent progress towards independently playing the pBuzz!



We have all worked hard on our individual PLG goals & undertaken a range of personalized numeracy & literacy activities. Here is some more information on a small selection of the work & activities we have undertaken.



English & Literacy

In English & Literacy our focus has been on developing our reading & writing skills. We have undertaken a range of activities to support our PLG's including doing phonics work & focusing on our selected text 'Danny Champion of the World' by Roald Dahl. We have all worked very hard on extending our vocabularies of words & using new words, phrases & concepts to better access our reading books & our class reading book. We read for 25 minutes each day and made lots of progress. We have undertaken a variety of Towards Independence literacy skills including using our skills in external settings such as Costa Coffee and Aldi supermarket.

ASDAN

In our ASDAN lessons we have focused on updating & completing our portfolios of work. We have impressed everyone with the pride & care we have taken with our work folders to make them a true reflection of our talents & potential across several different areas. Some of the range of activities have included traffic surveys, completing shopping lists, visiting café's and supermarkets amongst lots of others.

Math's & Numeracy

In Math's & Numeracy we have focused on learning via the ASDAN Towards Independence topics with have in part focused on using coins/notes to pay for in cafés and shops. We have also done a lot of work on tally and bar charts and linked these to other curriculum activities.



Science

In Science we have focused on the 'Electricity in the Home' topic. We have looked at and used lots of useful electrical equipment that we will use in our everyday lives. We really enjoyed 'playing' with dry ice and taking

part in a 'Science with Balloons' assembly as part of science week.



Humanities

As part of our study of the second world war in history we were lucky enough to visit the Imperial Museum North. We all had a great time, learned a lot and represented our school really well. We also really enjoyed our visit to St Albans Church.

Work Experience

We have all volunteered for and are carrying out important activities around the school as part of our internal work experience. This includes being hall monitors, being in charge of the organization and tidying up the library and helping out in Barnaby class with odd jobs.

PE & Swimming

We continue to really enjoy swimming with our fantastic swimming teacher, George, and we have all made progress with lots of students being awarded swimming badges and certificates for their hard work.

Sixth Form 1

Sixth form 1 students have been working hard and enjoying their learning.

During ICT sessions our students have been accessing cause and effect games and using switches or have been learning how to send emails and how use electrical equipment effectively and safely. 
