







Newsletter Arighi Class Summer 2018

In ICT some students have been using PowerPoint to make presentations of the work they have done during the week and some have been using switches to access music on the plasma screen.




In Humanities we have explored a range of topics including countries of the British Isles. We all enjoyed listening to music and tasting traditional foods associated with the different countries.


