What an amazing first term in our new class all pupils have settled in and are engaging so well in lessons. They have built new friendships and maintained those with peers they have moved up with. This term our theme has been superstars and heroes around us.

Some children have progressed with their engagement during their TACPAC, Sensology, Look and Listen, and Sensory Choir lessons. The children have particularly enjoyed the themed sessions during Halloween and currently our Christmas sessions.

In English we have focused on our core texts such as Super Duck and Mog the Vet. They have shown their understanding by story sequencing and through colourful semantics. In Maths we have looked at number and counting through sensory number songs, using play dough and sensory trays to support understanding.

We've welcomed in a new academic year and a new term by exploring our Autumn topic 'superstars – heroes around us'.

In English we have explored some new texts related to our topic, such as 'Super Duck', 'Ten Little Superheroes' and 'Mog V.E.T.' through and the Colourful Semantics and vocabulary matching tasks. We worked on our fine motor skills pretending to pull thorns from playdough shaped as Mog's paw and finding story items in sensory trays. We also explored various non-fiction texts, creating Halloween visual poems and creating actions when learning Autumn poems.

In Maths, we have looked at number and counting. Some pupils explored sensory number songs, such as '5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer' and '5 Little Ducks', while others began to explore the difference between more and less and even begin to explore addition and subtraction. Pupils particularly engaged with using number link cubes to aid their understanding.



To explore 'heroes around us', we have been learning all about people who help us both in school and in the community. In Challenge lessons, we have looked at the lifestyle and fitness routines of firefighters, and in Creativity we have explored music and art related to superheroes, including making our own flying superheroes with balloons! In Individuality, we enjoyed pretending to be emergency vehicles responding to traffic lights and the words 'stop/go', as well as exploring our emotions with the Zones of Regulation. In Community, we have explored the school to work on locating important areas, such as the nurse's office or the kitchen.

We have also engaged with many events and celebrations throughout the Autumn term, such as Children in Need, Remembrance Day and a school swap program with St John's School! We hope everyone has a lovely Christmas holiday and we can't wait to see you again next term

In Maths, we have worked on number and place value. We have really improved our addition and subtraction skills from numbers 1-20this year. We have also began café skills trips on a Friday morning to practice using money in real life contexts.

In Community we have ventured far and wide in our school bus to explore Macclesfield and its surrounding areas. Some places we have visited is: Redesmere Lake, Macclesfield Forest and surrounding areas, Macclesfield Centre and Poynton to name a few! We have also enjoyed sessions in class to learn about the impacts that WW1&2 had on children and the community. We have also continued with our weekly trips to South Park when the weather has alllowed us to. A fire engine and ambulance also came to visit us so we could learn further about our local super heroes!



Creativity sessions have consisted of making super hero art and exploring our favourte types of music as well as making our own! Music continues to run strong thoughout our day to day life in Middlewood class. We have practiced gross motor skills in PE and enjoyed weekly table cricket sessions! Additionally we have enjoyed swimming at Macclefield Lesuire Centre – this continues to be a firm favourite!In Challenge we have looked at ICT skills as well as forces such as Gravity and Resistence. We have enjoyed all the pratical elements that a typical Challenge sessions presents!

Arighi Class

English This term we have been taking on the role of superheroes in our story "superheroes don't get scared Or do they?". We have all had a go at some role play and writing letters about our feelings of being scared. Some of us even gave some good advice on what to do when we feel scared!

Maths In maths, we have been working on number. We have worked in small groups consolidating our knowledge of numbers 1-10 and beyond. We have used objects in our everyday lives e.g. plates, cups and toys to embed our number skills and use them throughout our daily routines.

Creativity Students have been getting artistic with their music making and artwork this term. We have made ourselves into pop art inspired by the artist Roy Lichtenstein. Students have also started to produce their written music and followed along with instruments!


Challenge We have been getting in the heads of computers this term as we have been programming for ICT. Students have programmed each other and the bee bot to move around the classroom to each different end point.

Community In community, we have explored superstars in our local community. We looked at the lives of the brothers behind 'Arighi Bianchi' and the building. We then explored the life of 'Alan Turing' and his work on code breaking, ending with some work on evacuees.

Treacle Class Happy Christmas from all the students & staff

Happy Christmas from all the students & staff of Treacle Class. We have had an action-packed & fun Christmas term where we have worked really hard and had lots of fun.

Here is some more information on a small selection of the work & activities we have undertaken:

In higher set Maths & Numeracy the students have all worked hard towards their entry-level certificate and have undertaken a range of activities across a wide variety of numeracy topics. In lower set ASDAN maths and numeracy we have focused on basic skills; the students have worked hard and with great enthusiasm. We have undertaken activities both in and out of the classroom and have particularly enjoyed our energetic active maths sessions in the hall.

In Literacy and English, the higher set, entry-level certificate group has worked hard on both English language and English literacy topics; we have learned to use many of the basic rules of grammar, such as simile and metaphor, and apostrophes. We have used these tools to examine a wide variety of prose, including Shakespeare, Dickens and poetry from around the world. I have been particularly impressed with the poetry writing skills of the class and their eagerness to both perform poetry to an audience and to give positive and supportive criticism to their colleagues in class.

We have had a great time swimming this term with our fantastic swimming teacher George. As well as learning a range of practical swimming skill, including water safety and a range of swimming strokes, the class has impressed all staff with their mature and polite nature when outside the classroom and interacted with members of the public. In PE we our primary focus has been on handball, and we have also had the recent pleasure of taking part in tag-rugby sessions with Sam from Sale Sharks. Working well as a team has been the most visible quality of Treacle this year and it has been great to see all members of the class look-out for each other and care for each other when someone is sad. At the Treacle staff are extremely proud of all the students for their kindness and maturity.



6th Form 1

Sixth form 1 students have had a busy, productive and enjoyable term. They have been developing their social, communication, vocational and academic skills onsite and in community settings.

Our students have enjoyed trips to Woodford Garden Centre Aquarium. They were able to identify different kinds of fish, and the shop staff talked to our young people about how to look after the different fish. Mini First Aid Cheshire ran a course for our Sixth Form students. They found the course really enjoyable and informative. Students got to learn and practice CPR, bandaging and abdominal thrust techniques.

Our students continue to receive excellent feedback from their employers. As part of our functional maths sessions, students have been sequencing numbers, events and tasks and sorting objects that are used in different practical activities. Sixth form 1 students have been leading the Schoolcycled Project, which encourages recycling throughout the school. They presented an assembly to upper school and monitor the bottle top collections points.
